3. Purpose of the processing

The application serves as a search engine to support human decision-making on institutions in terms of the SSM processes. To that extent, it only processes structured and unstructured data, containing e.g. news, guidelines, policies, ICAAP/ILAAP reports and SREP narratives, which are originally stored and maintained in other ECB / SSM services such as DARWIN, IDRA and DEVO. Its main purpose is to analyse financial institutions with respect to the different SREP categories: business model, governance and risk management, risks to capital and risk to

liquidity and funding.

Project ATHENA only indexes (it processes documents, applies models (not targeting personal data) to generate some information, like document sentiment, and stores that information to then be searchable by the end-user) information to enable its functionality. Some additional services, such as Optical character recognition (OCR) and document translation, are used to support the quality of the indexing process. Personal data is not in the focus of Project ATHENA, however, in rare cases personal data could potentially be contained in documents provided by financial institutions.

All documents are stored in external services, DARWIN and DEVO, and only the indexes are stored by ATHENA. As a result of this approach, if something gets deleted from the external services, the indexes are also deleted.

Microsoft does not retain the data sent to them and after processing it is deleted.
